Enlisted Men in World War.



COMSTOCK, DONALD R., Ensign in Sub-marine Service, U.S.N., (during War.)

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Isreal Comstock of the town of Benton, he enlisted in the Naval Reserve, Sub-marine Service, at New London, Conn., in the summer of 1918. Because of his previous technical education and experience he was commissioned Ensign, and reported for duty on the L-6, at Charleston, S.C. In October, 1918 he was sent to the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis in The Fifth Reserve Deck Officer's Class. He graduated there as a Short Course Man. He has remained in the Service, and at this date, June, 1923, he is stationed on the F-3, which is in active practice work at San Francisco, Cal. Commissioned Junior Lieutenant Jan. 1923. Enlistment credited to New York City.

BEATTIE, FREDERICK, Sergeant, Aviation Service.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. William Beattie of the town of Benton. *March 10, 1918*
Enlisted at Detroit, Mich. Sent to Columbus Barracks, Ohio: from thence to Kelly Field, San Antonio, Texas, and assigned to 63rd Aerial Squadron. Transferred to Gerstner Field, Lake Charles, Florida. Transferred to Ellington Field, Houston, Texas. Returned to Kelly Field, Tex. and assigned to 166th 1st Day Bombing Squadron. Commissioned Sergeant Feb. 1, 1919, acting as Pilot. Discharged at Camp Dix, N.J., April 24, 1920.
