Assigned to Company E, 302d Ammunition Train, 78th Division. Sailed for France, May 28, 1918, arriving in Liverpool, England, June 12, 1918, and in France, June —, 1918. Engagements at St. Mihiel and Argonne Woods. Discharged at Camp Dix, N. J., May 28, 1919. (Benton).

DUNN, HOMER, Private.

Assigned to Depot Brigade, then to Company D, 308th Infantry, and transferred to Camp Upton, N. Y. Sailed April 1, 1918, and arrived in France, April 14, 1918, with Company D, 308th Infantry, 77th Division. In battles of Argonne-Meuse, Chateau-Thierry, and Rheims. Wounded at Rheims by bullet in head. Discharged at Camp Upton, N. Y., December 24, 1918. (Benton).

JENSEN, CHRIS HENRY, Private.

Assigned to 28th Company, 151st Depot Brigade. Transferred to Camp Upton, N. Y., and assigned to Headquarters Company, 304th Field Artillery. Sailed April 21, 1918, arriving in Brest, France, April 28, 1918. In battle fronts at Alsace-Lorraine, Chateau-Thierry, Alsace-Vesle and Meuse-Argonne. Gassed at Mervolle September 15, 1918. Discharged at Camp Upton, N. Y., May 10, 1919. (Benton).

KESSLER, ERNEST E., Private.

Assigned to 27th Company, Depot Brigade; transferred to 328th Battalion, Tank Corps. Sailed for overseas September 25, 1918, arriving at Le Havre, France, October 9, 1918. With the Headquarters Tank Corps engaged in battles at Toul Sector, Marne River and Argonne. Discharged at Camp Meade, Maryland, April 11, 1919. (Benton).

KELSEY, WILLARD HETH, Private, 1st Class.

Assigned to 27th Training Battalion, 151st Depot Brigade. Transferred to Gettysburg, Penn., and assigned to 302d Battalion, Tank Corps, and with this Corps was transferred to Tobyhanna, Penn. Sailed from Hoboken, N. J., September 25, 1918, arriving at Liverpool, England, October 7, 1918, and assigned to 142d Military Police Company. Made Private of First Class at Gettysburg, Penn., July 1, 1918. Discharged at Fort Ontario, N. Y., April 2, 1919. (Benton).
