

Orange County for the Examination of Jeremiah Coleman of the Precinct of Goshen in
the said County Tylor taken before the Grand Jury at a Court of General
Sessions of the Peace held in and for the said County of Orange

The Examinant being duly sworn deposes and saith that on or
about the thirteenth of April 1777 he was taken Prisoner at Round Brook in
New Jersey by a part of the British Army and carried to New York where he was
in close confinement about six Weeks and then was taken out of confinement to
work at his Trade for the British, that he continued from that Time about ten
Months in the City of New York in which Time he was frequently at the
House of Nicholas Dean late of the Precinct of Goshen in the County of Orange
Yeoman, that the said Nicholas Dean then kept a Tavern in the City of New York
where the British Officers were entertained in a very friendly manner by the
said Nicholas Dean and his family as well as the Refugees from this and
other of the United States who had put themselves under the protection of the British
Army and this Deponent further saith that on a certain Time whilst he was
in New York as aforesaid he was at the house of the said Nicholas Dean drinking
a Bowl of Toddy in Company with one James Jordan when the said Nicholas Dean
came into the House with two British Officers and seeing this Deponent then
ordered him out of the House and told him (the Deponent) that (he the said Nicho-
las Dean) did not keep a House for Rebels and that the said Nicholas Dean turned
the said Deponent out of Doors without allowing him Time to drink his Liquor -
The deponent further saith that he was acquainted with the said Nicholas Dean in
the year 1774 whilst he (the said Nicholas Dean) lived in the Precinct of Goshen aforesaid
and further this Deponent saith vide Jeremiah Coleman
