The Examination and Deposition of James Marr late of Old England District in Tryon County at present of the City of Albany in the County of Albany

The said James Marr being duly sworn on the holy Evangelists depose that ^{Time} some in July or August in the year One thousand seven hundred and seventy seven the deponent was taken a prisoner ^{near} his then dwelling House in Old England District in Tryon County by Percival Carr late of Unadella Creek in Tryon County Farmer and Richard Brooks late of Old England District in Tryon County Yeoman who brot him the deponent to his own dwelling House where there were present James Campbell late of Cherry Valley in Tryon County Farmer John Campbell late of Cherry Valley in Tryon County Merchant, Elisha Marsh late of Old England District in Tryon County yeoman, Christopher Pierson, late of Old England District in Tryon County yeoman, and John Bullock late of Wood Lwes in Tryon County Laborer, who appeared to the deponent to be of a party with those two who first took him a prisoner. That the said Party above named took him a prisoner from his own House and obliged him to go with them in great haste that the said Persons took him a prisoner to the House occupied by the said Percival Carr, about sixteen miles from the House of the deponent and detained him a prisoner about seven Days so that he returned home on the eighth Day — That the said Party alleged against the deponent that he carried News to Cherry Valley against those who had adhered to the British King in the war which then subsisted between the said King and this State and the other united States of America, and the said Percival Carr threatened to take the deponent a prisoner to Joseph Brandt the Indian — That the said Carr went from home and on his Return informed that the Indians at the Orisco Battle had fought in through and out ^{through} the Americans and that a great Number of wounded Militia had been brought in among the Inhabitants in Tryon County, were under the Care of Doctor Petry — That the said Party would not permit the deponent to return to his Family until he had taken an Oath of Fidelity to the British King, otherwise they threatened to deliver the deponent to Joseph Brandt the Indian — That he was afterwards continued as a prisoner to the said Christopher Pierson so as appear to the said Pierson once in every day which the deponent continued for a number of weeks until he was relieved by a party from Cherry Valley — That several of the said Party had Arms when they took the deponent a prisoner — That the said John Bullock was one of the persons who had the deponent in Charge and Guarded him at two different Times —
