**CUNLEY, EARLE WYMAN, Private.**

Enlisted at Rochester, N. Y., June 1, 1917, and sent to Camp Wadsworth, Spartanburg, South Carolina, thence to Camp Stewart, Newport News, Virginia, from which place he sailed June 30, 1918, arriving at Brest, France, July 13, 1918, with 106th Ambulance Company, 102nd Sanitary Train, 27th Division, Battles—Hindenburg Line, September 29-30; LeSelle River vicinity, St. Souplet, October 17; Jone De Mer Ridge, October 18. Engagements—Vierstaat Ridge, Belgium, August 21-September 2; The Knoll, Giullemont, France, Quennemont Farm, September 27; St. Maurice River, October 19-20. Minor Engagements—East Poperinghe Line, Belgium, August 7-20; Dickebusch Sector, Belgium, August 21-30, 1918. Discharged at Camp Upton, N. Y., March 31, 1919.

**CULVER, HOLLIS HYDE, Private.**

Enlisted at Rochester, N. Y., June 19, 1917, and sent to League Island Navy Yard at Philadelphia, Penn., and assigned to Recruit Company M.; 106th Company, 8th Regiment, Marine Corps. Transferred to Galveston, Texas, to guard against trouble with Mexico; sent to Quantico, Virginia, transferred to 4th Separate Battalion, Company C. Sailed August 13, 1918, arriving at Brest,

France, August 22, 1918. Transferred to 84th Company, 6th Regiment, U. S. Marine Corps, 2d Division. Battles at Meuse-Argonne, November 1st to November 11, 1918, in Army of Occupation at Lautersdorf, Germany, seven months. Discharged at Quantico, Va., August 13, 1919.

**DAVIDSON, WILLIAM SIDNEY.**

Enlisted at Buffalo, N. Y., July 28, 1917, and sent to Camp Wadsworth, Spartanburg, South Carolina, and assigned to 74th Machine Gun, Federalized into the 108th Infantry. Transferred to Medical Unit.
