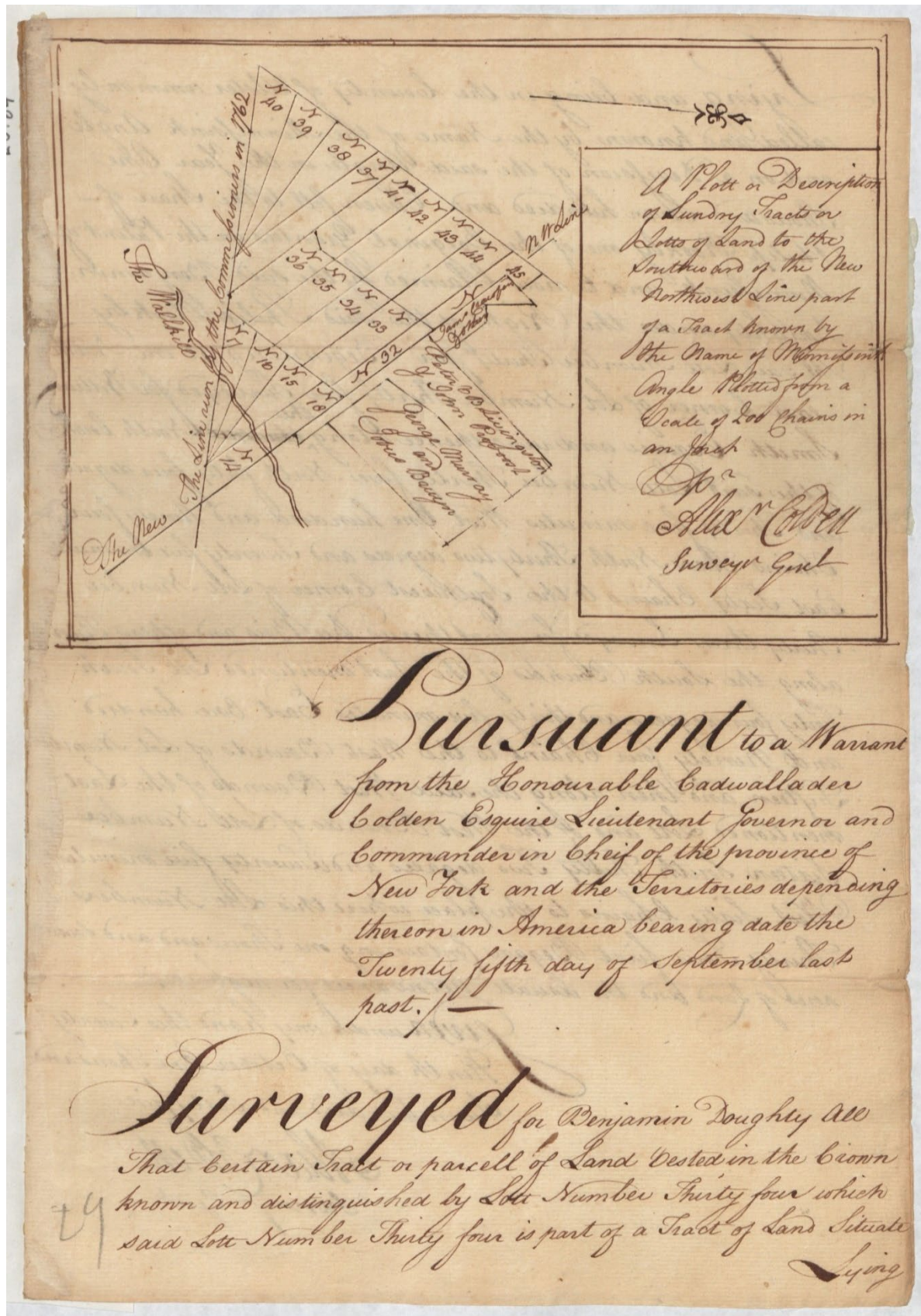

Pursuant to a Warrant from the Honourable Cadwallader Colden Esquire Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Cheif of the province of New York and the Territories depending thereon in America bearing date the Twenty fifth day of September last past.

Surveyed for Benjamin Doughty All That Certain Tract or parcell of Land vested in the Crown known and distinguished by Lott Number Thirty four which said Lott Number Thirty four is part of a Tract of Land Situate Lying

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and being in the County of Ulster, commonly called and known by the Name of the Minnissink Angle, and on a Division of the said Angle, in the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eleven fell to the share of Phillip Rookby one of the Original Grantees in the Patent of Minnissink and is now Claimed by the said Benjamin Doughty under the Right of the said Philip Rookby The said Lott Number Thirty four Beginning at the Northeast Corner. of Lot Number Thirty five Surveyed for William Smith Esquire and runs thence along the North bounds of the said Lott Number Thirty five North forty four degrees and Thirty five minutes West One hundred and Ninety four chains The North Thirty two degrees and Twenty five minutes East Sixty Chains to the Southwest Corner of Lott Number Thirty Three Surveyed for Sualtherus Du Bois and others. Then along the South Bound of the Last mentioned Lott South Forty four degrees and thirty five minutes East One hundred and ninety four Chains to the West Bounds of Lot Number Fifteen and then along the said West Bounds of the Last mentioned Lott and of the West Bounds of Lott Number Sixteen South thirty Two degrees and Twenty five minutes West Sixty Chains to the place where this Lott Number Thirty Four first began Containing one Thousand and Seventy acres of Land and the usuall Allowance for highways.
