A Steward Program term is 3-years and requires a pledge to raise and/or support the Trust's Annual Fund at a minimum of \$1,000+ per year (pledge of \$3,000+ for 3-year term).

The New York State Archives opened its doors to the public in 1978. A program of the State Education Department governed by the Regents of the University of the State of New York, the Archives cares for and provides access to more than 200 million documents that tell the story of New York from the seventeenth century to the present, oversees records management programs for state agencies, local governments, and provides archival advisory services for community organizations statewide.

Archives Mission Statement

The New York State Archives leads efforts, on behalf of all New Yorkers, to manage, preserve, ensure open access to, and promote the wide use of, records that support information needs and document the history, governments, events and peoples of our state. We strive for comprehensive,

equitable, and accessible documentation of our present, past and future through innovative partnerships and state-of-the-art approaches.



Recognizing the value of enlisting private citizens for partnerships and support of the Archives, New York's Governor and Legislature established The New York State Archives Partnership Trust as a 501(C)(3) non-profit and public authority in 1992. The Trust is governed by a board of directors committed to educational and cultural programming. Today, the Trust has developed and supported exceptional projects and programs including the Larry J. Hackman Research Residency Program, the Student Research Awards Program, conferences focusing on New York State history, special exhibitions, public education programs, teacher training institutes and resources, preservation projects and most notably, the award-winning magazine, New York Archives.

The New York State Archives Partnership Trust helps preserve and make accessible the archives from 350 years of New York's colonial and state governments. 
